

## **February Meeting Summary**





An experienced DXpedition team of 20 operators are in the advanced planning stages of a DXpedition to Bouvet Island (3YØZ). The DXpedition is scheduled for early 2018. This DXpedition may be the most expensive DXpedition ever! Bouvet Island is known as "The Most Isolated Island on Earth", and is currently ranked #2 on the ClubLog's "most wanted" list.

The DXpedition leaders are: Erling – LA6VM, Bob – K4UEE, and Ralph – KØIR. This is the same leadership team that brought you 3YØX-Peter I Island, K5D-Desecheo Island, HKØNA- Malpelo Island, FT5ZM-Amsterdam Island and, most recently, K1N-Navassa Island.

We have an extraordinary international team of 20 operators. These team members collectively have been part of scores of DXpeditions and have handed out an amazing 4,600,000 QSOs. The Antarctic and harsh climate experience of this team includes Heard Island, South Sandwich (twice) South Georgia (twice), the South Orkneys, and Peter I (twice). #### How to make a Simple Dipole Antenna


It is very easy to create a simple 1/2 wave dipole, all you need is some lengths of wire such as the core of some mains flex or even a straightened out metal coat hanger, some co-ax cable and a connector for your scanners antenna input (usually BNC or SMA).

The formula to calculate the length of the antenna is 147/frequency in MHz, this gives the total length of the dipole in meters.

For example, to make a 150MHz dipole: 147/150 = 98cm so each element of the dipole should be 49cm

Connect one end of each cut wire to one side of a piece of choc block and to the other sides connect the core and shield of a length of 75 ohm co-ax. Put a suitable connector for your scanner onto the other end of the co-ax and hang the antenna in a suitable position with the element that is connected to the center core of the co-ax pointing upwards.

The balanced 75 ohm impedance of a dipole should really be matched to the unbalanced impedance of the co-ax using a balun but this is not as



important for receiving only as it would be for transmitting. The mismatch will degrade the performance a little as it will reduce the overall sensitivity and possibly allow the co-ax feeder to act as an antenna and pick up some noise generated from within the building (eg. computers).





# Home Brew





#### **Building a J-Pole Antenna**

The Copper J-Pole Antenna has long been a favorite home brew antenna for Hams new and old. It is inexpensive, mechanically rugged, and when built properly, performs very well. The antenna is simple with a ½ wave radiating section and matched to a 1/4 wave shorted stub, which creates the "J" in the J-Pole. It is fed direct with 50 Ohm Coax and requires no special matching, as the matching section is part of the design. It is also a popular construction project for people who do portable and emergency communications.

One thing that has been discovered is many of the published J-Pole construction articles in print, and on the Internet, show the connections for the coax center conductor and shield backwards! Many of the articles depict the coax center conductor connecting to the shorter 19" leg of the "J" and the coax shield going to the longer leg of the J. This is backwards. There are even people selling J-Poles on the Internet that are fabricated incorrectly!

Even if the antenna is constructed this way, it will show a nice low SWR, but the antenna will radiate far less energy than it is capable of. The long leg of the J -Pole needs to be connected to the coax center conductor to get optimum current flow allowing the antenna to radiate efficiently, and receive as much signal as possible. This is a perfect example of how low SWR can

trick you into thinking the antenna is performing well.

When the short 19" element of the J is fed with the coax center conductor, the entire length of that element is paralleled by the grounded half of the J which carries equal and opposite RF current, thus canceling out the radiated energy in the 19" element. When the center conductor is connected to the longer element, the RF waves will still cancel along the J portion of the antenna, but in this case will mostly continue past the J into the ½ wave radiating section and RF energy radiates into free space.

from all around the globe. In high school (1970's), I bought my first Citizen Band radio and attained a FCC license of KACQ1995; back then you needed a license to use the CB. My handle was the "Krazy Man" and I hung out with other high schoolers, who used the CB radio as a chat room or what we now call "Twitter." I joined the Air Force and became an aircraft mechanic or Crew Chief on cargo planes (C-141 Lockheed Starlifter). One of my duties was to test the functionality of the HR radios in the cockpit. From San Bernardino (Norton AFB), I would call up to Anchorage (Elmendorf AFB) and have shot conversations; on occasions the conversations would spread to Tokyo (Yokota AFB). After the military, I became a cop in rural Riverside County. Back in the 1990's

our work radios were poor performers. To supplement my communications abili-

ties, I entered into the world of GMRS and amateur radio. I have now gone full circle into the evolution of radio communications.

Service" during wartime was developed in 1952 as result of input from the <u>American Radio Relay League</u> and the Department of the Army's Office of Civil Defense.

Linda Scheetz (Mann) ( lischeetz ) said:


