General Meeting - May 12, 2016, 7:00 pm

For the "Show and Tell" program portion, Jim Weaver AG6JN gave an informative demonstration and instructions on the Arduino microprocessor he built.



My Arduino Repeater Project

I started this project originally because I was interested in the Arduino micro processor board. Being a retired Electronic engineer in the field of circuit design, human/electronic interface and software design and programming, this seemed like a neat hobby project to keep me busy. As I looked around for an application I thought what a great project a cross band repeater would be. As my "radio shack" is on the second floor of my house and all the antennae are on the roof, I have a problem when I'm in the family room. Also, my HT won't quite reach the W6TJ repeater, but surely it would reach the radios upstairs.

As the design progressed I added lots of not really needed "bells and whistles." First there was the LED display to allow setting of various internal parameters. Then, of course, a clock would be nice. This one will run for three years on an internal battery and claims to be accurate to +/- one second in a year. There is also a DTMF (touch tone) detector to turn it on/off over the air and/or ask for other functions such as TOD. A voice synthesizer (made by SpeakJet) to enunciate

the call sign and messages requested by the DTMF. A bunch of timers are software implemented to furnish appropriate call sign ID and to prohibit conversations that are too long (currently set at 3 minutes but adjustable.)

This is all controlled by the Arduino which is programmed in the C language on a PC. Once the program is downloaded into the Arduino the PC is no longer required, only an alternate five volt power source. The repeater is currently connected to two BaoFeng UV5R HT's via an Ethernet type cable but any radios that present a PTT (push-to-talk) an unsquelched signal and audio in/out signals is suitable.


