Get ready to test and remote test using your personal computer

Several ways are available for you to ready yourself to take an Amateur Radio License test. One way is to do your studying on Ham Study:

The hamstudy.org site above is a site associated with remote testing across the USA (and its possessions), and along with GLAARG (Greater Los Angeles Amateur Radio Group) VEC. On-line testing is now available for all license classes. The advantage of using hamstudy.org is the testing format is similar to the tests you will see when testing with GLAARG.

Other VEC's are starting to remote test, but I am not familiar with their procedures. You can find testing sessions on the ham study site for several different VEC's. If you choose to test with a VEC other than GLAARG, please contact the VEC to determine their requirements. Some VEC's are testing by reservation only from a list, and some are only testing in certain areas.

If you want a GLAARG test session, you can scroll down the list and look for GLAARG, or even better, scroll the right two columns and look for the \$10 test fee. As of May 2020, GLAARG is the only VEC remote testing for \$10
